THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

“For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you made me welcome...”

Matthew 25:31-46

All of us have been at funerals and memorial services. All of us have heard the words spoken on these occasions. Often there is something strange about them. It is not for nothing that they are called “eulogies”, or “good and nice words.”

A man is praised for his family-mindedness, though during his lifetime everyone said that he had only time for work. A woman whose only interest was money is praised for her open heart and open hand to all who asked her help.

It sounds almost like a conspiracy. And it is! We are quite willing to forgive each other, because we all know that we need to be forgiven, too!

The way Matthew sees it, when we all stand in front of Jesus at the end of time, we all will hope to be judged in that way. We all will be only too aware of the times that we didn't live up to the Christian ideal. We will also remember the times we did.

And even if we remember at that moment the times that others betrayed us and left us alone, we will be only too glad when Jesus doesn't remember, and forgets and forgives them. We definitely wouldn't remind him of it, hoping that we, too, will be treated in the same way.

It is the moment when “forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us” takes on new meaning.

That might be the reason that we don't want to hear anything but good about the dead! Let us pray that the good we do will be remembered, and that the evil will be forgotten and forgiven. Let us live in a way that makes this final judgement possible.
